VETERANS SERVICE OFFICERS

Upon your separation from the military, one of the first and most critical relationships to establish is with your local Veterans Service Officer (VSO). Located in cities and towns across Massachusetts, VSOs are dedicated to helping you and your family access your veteran benefits, such as Chapter 115 financial assistance, healthcare, housing, and education.





Your VSO can also help you apply for U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs benefits, including service-connected disability claims, job readiness, home loans, and burial benefits.




STATEWIDE ADVOCACY FOR VETERANS EMPOWERMENT (SAVE) PROGRAM

SAVE is a peer outreach program that connects veterans, helps them access benefits and services, and supports their mental health.

SAVE acts as a liaison between veterans, their families, and the various federal and state government agencies to advocate for veterans who cannot obtain benefits due to institutional or personal barriers.

The program's primary mission is to prevent suicide and mental health distress.



The SAVE team works closely and in collaboration with the Massachusetts National Guard. Resources offered by the Massachusetts National Guard and their Family Readiness Program are available to all service members and their families, regardless of the branch in which they serve.



SUPPORTING & EMPOWERING REINTEGRATION FOR VETERANS EQUALITY (SERVE)

SERVE specialists provide peer support to Veteran Treatment Courts (VTC) and Diversion programs. Each program aims to assist veterans by connecting them with services and supporting them in the pre-court process.

VTC programs are court-supervised, treatment-focused collaboratives for defendants who have served in the United States Armed Forces.

SERVE specialists work with primarily non-VA eligible veterans to complete either program through a coordinated effort among the veteran's services delivery system, community-based providers, and the court.


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

MASSVETS (INCLUDING ANNUITY BENEFIT)

The Executive Office of Veterans Services offers a financial safety net program called <u>MASSVETS</u> to low-income veterans living in the Commonwealth to help pay for daily living expenses, medical costs, housing, and other necessities.



MASSACHUSETTS VETERAN BONUSES

Administered by the Office of the State Treasurer and Receiver General, the Veterans Bonus Division provides bonus payments for veterans, service members, and their families for qualified service in the U.S. military.

MASSACHUSETTS WELCOME HOME "GWOT" BONUS

The Welcome Home "GWOT" Bonus is reserved for active and discharged service members who served after September 11, 2001, with six months of continuous active service within the Continental United States (CONUS), outside the continental U.S (OCONUS), or Service in Iraq, Afghanistan, or other imminent danger locations.

MASSACHUSETTS COVID-19 BONUS FOR MASS NATIONAL GUARD

The Massachusetts COVID-19 Bonus is available to members of the National Guard who were activated in response to the state of emergency declared by the governor on March 10, 2020. Eligible members may be entitled to a first/one-time \$500 bonus or a \$250 subsequent bonus for any additional activations during the eligibility dates from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

PERSIAN GULF WAR VETERANS BONUS

The Persian Gulf War Veterans Bonus is available to veterans who lived in Massachusetts before entering the military, served honorably, and served within the timeframe of August 2, 1990, to April 10, 1991. This is a one-time bonus of \$300 for active service for at least 30 days in an area other than the Persian Gulf and a \$500 bonus for active service in the Persian Gulf area and awarded the Southwest Asia Service Medal.

ARMED FORCES EXPEDITIONARY MEDAL (AFEM) BONUS (1976 – 2001)

The Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal Bonus is a one-time \$300 bonus for veterans who lived in Massachusetts immediately before entering the military, served honorably, and were awarded the AFEM for participation in combat operations when no other bonus was available. The main years that this bonus covers are 1976–1989 and 1992–2000.

VIETNAM CONFLICT, WORLD WAR II AND KOREAN WAR VETERAN BONUSES

Massachusetts veterans and family members of deceased veterans of the Vietnam Conflict, World War II, and the Korean War are eligible for their bonuses.

EDUCATION

POST 9/11 GI BILL

The Post-9/11 GI Bill offers financial support for education, housing, and more.

To be eligible for 100% benefits, an individual must have:

- Served on active duty for at least 1,095 days (36 months)
- Received a Purple Heart post-9/11, or
- Served for 30 continuous days with a service-connected disability discharge.

For those who served less than 36 months, eligibility is partially determined by the total time served on active duty, with or without breaks. The percentage of benefits varies based on the duration of service:

- Less than 90 days: Ineligible
- 90 days to 6 months: 50%
- 6 months to 1 year: 60%
- 1 to 18 months: 70%
- 18 to 24 months: 80%
- 24 to 30 months: 90%
- 30 to 36 months: 100%

Days	Months	% of Benefit
910 to 1,094 days	30 to 35 months	90% of the full benefit
730 to 909 days	24 to 29 months	80% of the full benefit
545 to 729 days	18 to 23 months	70% of the full benefit
180 to 544 days	6 to 17 months	60% of the full benefit

GI Bill full rates for school and training programs: August 1, 2023, to July 31, 2024

The amounts listed below are the maximum the VA will pay within an academic year for each type of school or training program.

Monthly Housing Allowance

Veterans eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill may also receive financial assistance for housing while studying. The Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA) is disbursed at the end of each month and is calculated based on two factors:

- The percentage of post-9/11 GI Bill benefits the veteran is eligible for
- Amount of credits the veteran is taking, or how many clock hours they're scheduled to attend per week.

GI BILL COMPARISON TOOL

The GI Bill Comparison tool allows you to learn about and compare your GI Bill benefits at approved schools, employers, and VET TEC providers. It highlights the total tuition benefit, housing benefit, accreditation, and number of GI bill students enrolled at the institution.

YELLOW RIBBON PROGRAM

The Yellow Ribbon Program can help pay for higher out-of-state, private school, foreign school, or graduate school tuition and fees that the Post-9/11 GI Bill doesn't cover. For veterans who already have Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits, this program may help pay for tuition at a college or other institution of higher learning. The amount of money awarded varies by school, degree type, and the academic program one is enrolled in. Find out if a school participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program and see the additional amount they offer.

MASSACHUSETTS CATEGORICAL TUITION WAIVER

The Massachusetts Department of Higher Education (DHE) Categorical Tuition Waiver provides financial support to active members of the Armed Forces stationed/residing in MA and veterans discharged honorably who served 90 days or more. Assistance continues as long as the student meets all the eligibility criteria. MASSACHUSETTS NATIONAL GUARD TUITION & FEE WAIVER

The Massachusetts National Guard Education Assistance Program provides a 100% tuition and fee waiver for Massachusetts Army National Guard members attending a state college, university, or community college program. You can continue as long as you are in good academic standing until you have reached 130 semester hours. You must request a Certificate of Eligibility for every 30 credits from the MA National Guard Education Office to apply. To request on call: (508) 968-5889.

The Massachusetts Public Service Grant is a financial benefit for students who have experienced the loss of a parent and spouse in the line of public service duty in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. VETERANS UPWARD BOUND PROGRAM

The Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) Program is a pre-college program that aims to assist veterans in developing the necessary academic skills for acceptance, success, and completion in a program of post-secondary study. The program provides assessment and enhancement of essential skills through counseling, mentoring, tutoring, and academic instruction in the core subject areas.

The My Career Advancement Account Scholarship is a workforce development program that provides up to \$4,000 in financial assistance to eligible military spouses to pursue a license, certification, or associate's degree necessary to gain employment in an occupation or career field.

The VA Work Study Allowance Program is a program that allows students receiving VA educational benefits to earn money while they are working on their education. This program is funded by the VA, with participating individuals paid directly by the VA.



HOUSING AND OUTREACH CENTERS

The Executive Office of Veterans Services supports select non-profit organizations that provide housing services to eligible veterans. Housing services range from emergency homeless shelters and group residences to single occupancy (SRO) quarters.

MASS VETERAN EMPLOYMENT REPRESENTATIVES

Veterans Employment Representatives (VERs) are state employees in the Commonwealth's MassHire Career Centers. VERs assist veterans with organizing their job search, crafting a personal employment plan, writing a resume, and developing job leads.

OFF-BASE TRANSITION TRAINING (OBTT)

OBTT is a program for veterans and their spouses that offers robust workshops to help meet their employment goals. OBTT offers ten inperson and virtual workshops at no cost. Veterans can mix and match workshops to meet their employment goals and attend conferences at their own pace.

Massachusetts state veteran employees may be eligible to purchase up to four years of military service if they qualify as veterans, as defined in M.G.L. c. 32, Section 1.

VA DISABILITY CLAIM

VA disability compensation provides tax-free monthly payments to qualifying veterans. Any veteran with a service-connected condition (an illness or injury that was caused by—or worsened because of active military service) may be eligible for compensation.

MASSACHUSETTS VET CENTERS

VA-operated Vet Centers offer confidential counseling services to veterans, service members, and their families, addressing war-related issues and transitions. Staffed by experienced counselors, many of whom are veterans, these community-based centers provide support for war-related challenges, loss, grief, and trauma transitions.

PACT ACT

The PACT Act is a recent law that broadens VA health care and benefits for veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances. It introduces additional health conditions presumed to be service-connected due to such exposures, enhancing the VA's ability to offer deserving veterans and their survivors the care and benefits they have earned.

VA Home Loans are provided by private lenders such as banks and mortgage companies. VA guarantees a portion of the loan, enabling the lender to offer more favorable terms. DISABILITY HOUSING GRANTS FOR VETERANS

The VA offers housing grants for veterans with specific service-connected disabilities to buy or adapt a home to meet their needs and live more independently. These changes can include things like installing ramps or widening doorways. To be eligible for a Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) Grant, you must own or will own the home and have a qualifying service-connected disability.

HISA benefits provide medically necessary improvements and structural alterations to a veteran's primary residence for the following purposes: allowing entrance to or exit from their homes, use of essential lavatory and sanitary facilities, allowing accessibility to kitchen or bathroom sinks or counters, improving plumbing/electrical systems, and more. HISA can provide lifetime benefits up to \$6,800.

HOMES FOR OUR TROOPS (HFOT)

Homes for Our Troops is a publicly funded non-profit organization that builds and donates specially adapted custom homes nationwide for severely injured post-9/11 veterans, enabling them to rebuild their lives.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS

To qualify, all veterans and applicable spouses must:

- Be legal residents of Massachusetts;
- Occupy the property as their domicile on July 1 in the year of application;
- Have lived in Massachusetts for at least six months before entering the service (spouses are exempt);
- Have lived in Massachusetts for five consecutive years before filing for a property tax exemption.

Eligibility Criteria	Tax Exemption Amount	
10% (or more) service-connected disabled veterans; Purple Heart recipients; Gold Star mothers and fathers; Spouses of veterans entitled under Clause 22; Surviving spouses who do not remarry.	\$400.00	
Loss or loss of use of one hand above the wrist, or one foot above the ankle or one eye; Medal of Honor; Distinguished Service Cross; Navy Cross or Air Force Cross.	\$750.00
